Martyrs Menodora, Metrodora and Nymphodora of Bithynia; Empress Pulcheria; Peter, bishop of Nicaea

The First Antiphon

O Lord, remember David and all his meekness. Lo, we heard of it at Ephrata; we found it in the fields of the wood.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

Glorious things are spoken of thee, O city of God. God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God shall help her, and that right early. (*Refrain*)

Glory... Both now... (Refrain)

The Second Antiphon

The Lord hath sworn in truth unto David; and He will not turn from it. Of the fruit of thy body will I set upon thy throne.

Refrain: Save us, O Son of God, <u>Who art risen from the dead</u>; who sing unto Thee. Alleluia.

There will I make the horn of David to bud; I have ordained a lamp for mine anointed. (*Refrain*)

For the Lord hath chosen Zion; He hath desired it for His habitation. (*Refrain*)

Glory... Both now... Only begotten Son and Word of God...

The Third Antiphon

Here will I dwell, for I have desired it. The Most High hath sanctified His tabernacle. Holy is Thy temple, and wonderful in righteousness. (then *chant the Troparion of the Nativity of the Theotokos*)

Resurrectional Troparion (Tone 5)

Let us believers praise and worship the Word; coeternal with the Father and the Spirit, born of the Virgin for our salvation. For, He took pleasure in ascending the Cross in the flesh to suffer death; and to raise the dead by His glorious Resurrection.

Troparion of the Nativity of the Theotokos (Tone 4)

Thy nativity, O Theotokos, hath proclaimed joy to the whole universe; for from thee did shine forth the Sun of justice, Christ our God, annulling the curse and bestowing the blessing, abolishing death and granting us life everlasting.

Troparion for St. Raphael of Brooklyn (Tone 3)

Rejoice, O Father Raphael, Adornment of the holy Church! Thou art Champion of the True Faith, Seeker of the lost, Consolation of the Oppressed, Father to orphans and Friend of the poor, Peacemaker and good Shepherd, Joy of all the Orthodox, Son of Antioch, Boast of America. Intercede with Christ God for us and for all who honor thee.

Kontakion of the Nativity of the Theotokos (Tone 4)

By thy holy nativity, O pure one, Joachim and Anna were delivered from the reproach of barrenness; and Adam and Eve were delivered from the corruption of death; thy people do celebrate it, having been saved from the stain of iniquity, crying unto thee: The barren doth give birth to the Theotokos, who nourisheth our life.

The Prokeimenon

O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance. To Thee, O Lord, I have cried, O my God.

Epistle

Brethren, see with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that would compel you to be circumcised and only in order that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. For even those who receive circumcision do not themselves keep the Law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may glory in your flesh. But far be it from me to glory except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me and I to the world. For neither circumcision counts for anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. Peace and mercy be upon all, who walk by this rule, upon the Israel of God. Henceforth let no man trouble me; for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brethren. Amen.

The Lord said, "No one has ascended into heaven but He who descended from heaven, the Son of man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of man be lifted up, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. Know your faith. The Gospel, according to St. Paul, has the following two main teachings: the <u>death</u> and the <u>resurrection</u> of Christ. To whom is the Gospel to be preached? <u>All nations of the world</u> (Mark 16:15). The 10 Commandments can be summarized as our duty to <u>God</u> and our duty to <u>our</u> <u>neighbor (all people)</u>. The Nativity of the Theotokos is celebrated on <u>September 8</u>. (T/F) Her birth is recorded in Luke 1. Who were her parents? <u>Joachim and Anna</u>. In Matins, Mary is acclaimed as the Theotokos (the birth-giver of God) and the Mother of the <u>Light</u>. On November 21 we celebrate the <u>Presentation of the Theotokos in the Temple</u>. The Orthodox Church celebrates <u>12</u> major feasts during the church year. 7 of the feasts are for <u>Christ</u> and <u>5</u> are for <u>the Theotokos</u>. Is Pascha one of those feasts? (Y/N). Why? <u>Because it is the "feast of feasts."</u>

The Feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross is an opportunity outside of the observances of Holy Week to celebrate the full significance of the victory of the Cross over the powers of the world, and the triumph of the wisdom of God through the Cross over the wisdom of this world. This Feast also gives the Church an opportunity to relish the full glory of the Cross as a source of light, hope and victory for Christ's people. It is also a time to celebrate the universality of the work of redemption accomplished through the Cross.




